We provide learning experiences to help each fifth grade student...

1. Acknowledge with confidence God's plan of salvation as clearly revealed in Scripture.
2. Determine whether selected Bible passages reveal God's Law or God's Gospel message –the Good News of salvation by grace through faith in Jesus Christ-or both.
3. Use Bible reference tools to discover Gospel passages.
4. Praise God for His plan of salvation.
5. Describe Scripture as the work of many human authors and yet the pure, "God-breathed" Word.
6. Identify grace as the motivation for good works.
7. Express joy and confidence in the forgiveness God freely offers them through Christ.
8. Acknowledge Holy Scripture as the final authority for both doctrine and practice.
9. Describe the impact of God's Law and Gospel on their lives.
10. Compare the old covenant with God's new covenant in Jesus.
11. Recognize signs of God's love and care in their own lives.
12. Recognize that God is faithful, strengthens them, and gives them the victory over their enemies-sin, death, and the devil.
13. Express reliance of God and His Word for courage, wisdom, and direction throughout their lives.
14. Recognize that no force is more powerful than God and His love for them in Christ.
15. Identify opportunities in which the Holy Spirit can use them in service to God.
16. Trust that God will accomplish His good purposes in their lives, even in times of conflict and crisis.
17. Acknowledge Christ's forgiveness and rely on the Holy Spirit's power to share God's love with others.
18. Express confident trust that Jesus their Savior will renew and strengthen them to respond with forgiveness toward others.
19. Define worship as our response to God's grace in which we demonstrate our love, honor, and respect for Him in everything we say and do.
20. Acknowledge Jesus as the Messiah, the Christ who fulfilled Old Testament prophecies.
21. Recognize that through the means of grace, the Holy Spirit leads people to identify and trust in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.
22. Realize that the Holy Spirit empowers us to live as God's children.
23. Express confident trust in God's promise to work through the means of grace to help them overcome the temptations they face.
24. Acknowledge that through His suffering and death, Jesus earned forgiveness of sin and eternal life for them and for all people.
25. Appreciate the need to witness to all people, including people of every race, color, and nationality.
26. Study Bible references that describe the joy that awaits them in heaven through faith in Jesus Christ.
27. Actively participates in worship planning and leading worship.
28. Demonstrate faith through mission projects.

We provide learning experiences to help each fifth grade student ...

1. Recognize and apply Christian values and teachings in the literature selections.
2. Identify sequence of events in a story.

15. Describe the early settlers in the middle colonies and why they moved there.
16. Describe the reasons settlers went to the southern colonies.

19. Analyze the causes of the French and Indian War.

6. Appreciate the God-given gifts of intelligence and curiosity and recognize the role of books in expanding their knowledge of God's world.
7. Recognize the library as a resource for supporting and enhancing the classroom subjects.
8. Recognize the role of the librarian in finding and choosing appropriate materials.
9. Have the opportunity to choose books to check out.
10. Learn to follow circulation procedures as instructed.
11. Recognize the importance of personal responsibility in the care of the library books both in the library and at home.
12. Recognize the importance of returning the books in a timely fashion.
13. Become familiar with the Dewey Decimal System and its role in keeping order in the library.
14. Recognize and use basic library terms.
15. Learn attributes to look for in choosing reading materials.
16. Become familiar with literary genres.
17. Be introduced to a variety of awards for children's literature.
18. Learn to use bibliographies and critical reviews in choosing library materials.
19. Be given the opportunity to participate and vote in the Louisiana Young Readers Choice program.
20. Learn how to choose appropriate non-fiction materials for research including both hard copy and Internet sources.
21. Learn to discern the reliability of resources, especially online sources.
22. Become personally responsible for choice of reading materials.
23. Learn to use Online Public Access Catalog in school library.

Fifth Grade Music Curriculum

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We provide learning experiences to help each fifth grade student ...

1. Explain that the gifts of music and singing are from God.
2. Identify pitches by letter name and solfege syllables on the musical staff.
3. Perform ostinatos using various rhythms.
4. Identify changed and unchanged voices.
5. Identify soprano, alto, tenor, and bass voices.
6. Identify major and minor tonalities.
7. Distinguish between half steps and whole steps in major and minor scales.
8. Sing harmony parts such as descants, partner songs, ostinatos and canons.
9. Identify *mezzo forte*=*mf*(medium loud) and *fortissimo*=*ff*(very loud).
10. Identify accents.
11. Identify crescendo and decrescendo.
12. Identify flats and sharps.
13. Conduct in two, three and four beat patterns.
14. Identify and use rhythm patterns combining eighth notes and sixteenth notes.
15. Recognize I, IV, and V chords.
16. Identify various musical forms including AB, ABA, and rondo (ABACA).
17. Identify brass, woodwind, string and percussion families.
18. Recognize rhythm patterns using dotted quarter followed by eighth note and dotted eighth note followed by sixteenth.
19. Identify by sight and sound various keyboard instruments.
20. Study the popular music timeline of the 20th century.
21. Experience a wide variety of musical styles including sacred and secular.
22. Lead worship through singing in Chapel and church services.
23. Participate in the elective band program.
24. Read and perform melodic intervals and patterns.
